Dear Dad,

Deuteronomy 6:4-7 contains what is called the Shema, and is the charge for every father to teach his children things of God.

“Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.”

In today’s fast paced and busy world, parents reluctantly relinquish their parental duties of rearing godly children to substitutes. The result is that many parents never speak of spiritual things with their children. The only religious instruction that a child receives is on Sunday mornings for only a short while in Sunday School. Over time, this pattern of substitute religious discipline becomes a habit; parents no longer see the charge to teach the love of God to their children as a command, but as an option if properly equipped. Because parents do not feel properly equipped to disciple their own children, they no longer *reluctantly* hand over spiritual discipleship of their children to another adult, but they *eagerly* trade the responsibility.

Since a child only hears of spiritual things for 1 hour a week, it is no surprise that Christians know very little of Christian truths. We have a generation of Christian parents who have grown up not being disciplined, and the thought of discipling a child is dreadfully terrifying.

This book will serve as a way of teaching spiritual truths to the parent and to the child. You will be required to spend a small amount of time with your child each day. You will ask your child one question, and have him recite back the answer to the question. After he responds, then you will read a proof text that explains the answer to the question and talk with your child how the verse proves the answer to the question. When reading the proof text, I encourage you to read the passage from a Bible, or even better yet, if your child is able to read, have him find the verse in his Bible and read it to you. After reading the verse, allow your child to ask questions and stand firm upon God’s Word to answer all his questions.

This pattern will continue five days a week. In the process, you and your child will learn basic Christian truths, and be able to give Scripture to back up these truths. I want to help fathers and husbands in their role as spiritual leaders of the family. Hopefully, this time will stand as a critical point in the development of your child’s faith in the Lord.

In the process, may God be glorified by households that know His Word and Truth.

Notes

Question 1: What is the chief end of man?

Answer: The chief end of man is to glorify God, and to enjoy Him forever.

Psalm 86:7-12

In the day of my trouble I call upon you, for you answer me.
There is none like you among the gods, O Lord, nor are there any works like yours. All the nations you have made shall come and worship before you, O Lord, and shall glorify your name. For you are great and do wondrous things: you alone are God. Teach me your way, O Lord, that I may walk in your truth; unite my heart to fear your name. I give thanks to you, O Lord my God, with my whole heart, and I will glorify your name forever.

Question 2: How has God revealed to us how to glorify and enjoy Him?

Answer: The Bible; the Old and New Testaments are the words of God to show us how to glorify and enjoy Him.

II Peter 1:20-21

Question 3: What does the Bible teach?

Question 6: How many persons are in the Godhead?

Question 7: What are the decrees of God?

Answer: The decrees of God are His eternal purposes which He wills to happen for His own glory.

Question 8: How do we know there is a God?

Question 9: How did God create what is seen and unseen?

Answer: God expected perfect obedience, and forbid him to eat of the tree of knowledge of good and evil, or else face death.

And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, "You may surely eat of every tree of the garden, but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."

James 2:10

For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it.

Question 11: What is sin?

Answer: Sin is breaking the law of God.

Leviticus 5:17

“If anyone sins, doing any of the things that by the Lord’s commandments ought not to be done, though he did not know it, then realizes his guilt, he shall bear his iniquity.”

James 4:17

So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin.

I John 3:4

Everyone who makes a practice of sinning also practices lawlessness; sin is lawlessness

James 1:15

Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death.

Galatians 5:16-21

But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. Question 12: What happened to mankind after the fall?

Answer: The fall brought mankind into sin and misery.

Genesis 3:16

To the woman he said, "I will surely multiply your pain in childbearing; in pain you shall bring forth children. Your desire shall be for your husband, and he shall rule over you.

Romans 3:10-18

as it is written: "None is righteous, no, not one; no one understands; no one seeks for God. All have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one. Their throat is an open grave; they use their tongues to deceive. The venom of asps is under their lips. Their mouth is full of curses and bitterness. Their feet are swift to shed blood; in their path are ruin and misery, and the way of peace they have not known. There is no fear of God before their eyes."

Question 13: What is the misery that man fell into because of sin?

Answer: All people lost fellowship with God, are under His wrath, and deserve death and Hell.

And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden.

John 8:34

Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who practices sin is a slave of sin."

Ephesians 2:12

remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world.

Ephesians 4:18

They are darkened in their understanding, alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, due to their hardness of heart.

Question 14: How has the fall effected the heart of man?

Answer: Because of Adam's disobedience, the heart of man is set on wickedness.

The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it?

Mark 7:20-23

And he said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him. For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person."

Ephesians 2:1-3

And you were dead in the trespasses and sins in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience - among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind.

Question 15: Did God leave mankind to perish and be condemned?

Answer: God, from before the foundation of the earth, chose to save a people for everlasting life.

Ephesians 1:4-5

even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love he predestined us for adoption as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will,

II Thessalonians 2:13-14

But we ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the firstfruits to be saved, through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth. To this he called you through our gospel, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Hebrews 9:15

And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.

Question 17: What does Jesus do as our Redeemer?

Answer: Jesus is our Redeemer by being prophet, priest and king.

Deuteronomy 18:18

I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their brothers. And I will put my words in his mouth, and he shall speak to them all that I command him.

Hebrews 1:1-2

Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom he also created the world.

Hebrews 4:14-15

Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin.

Question 18: How was Christ humble?

Answer: Christ demonstrated humility by being born in the flesh into poor conditions, lived under the law, suffered the curse of death on a cross, and the wrath of God.

Luke 2:7

And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

II Corinthians 8:9

For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for our sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich.

Isaiah 53:3

He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

Philippians 2:8

And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

Question 19: How is Jesus exalted?

Answer: Jesus is exalted by rising from the dead, being seated at the right hand of God the Father, and coming to judge the world on the last day.

I Corinthians 15:4

that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures,

Psalm 110:1

The Lord says to my Lord: "Sit at my right hand, until I make your enemies your footstool."

Hebrews 1:3

He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,

Matthew 16:27

For the Son of Man is going to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay each person according to what he has done.

Acts 17:31

because he has fixed a day on which he will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed; and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead.



Question 20: How is the redemption of Jesus applied to one's life?

Answer: We become the redeemed of Christ by the Holy Spirit.

Titus 3:4-7

But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

I Corinthians 2:12

Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God.

Ephesians 2:8

For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God.

John 15:5

I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.

Ezekiel 36:25-27

Question 21: What is effectual calling?

Answer: Effectual calling is the work of God's Spirit; convincing us of our sin, opening our minds to Christ, and the changing of our hearts.

Acts 26:18

"to open their eyes, so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the power of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me."

II Corinthians 4:6

For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

Ephesians 1:17-18

that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints,

Deuteronomy 30:6

Question 22: What is justification?

Answer: Justification is the act of God pardoning us of our sins, and accepting us as righteous in His sight.

Romans 3:23-24

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.

II Corinthians 5:21

For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Romans 5:18-19

Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.

Galatians 2:16

Yet we know that a person is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, so we also have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the law, because by works of the law no one will be justified.

Question 23: What is sanctification?

Answer: Sanctification is the work of God's grace where we are renewed and become more Christlike.

Ezekiel 36:27

And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules.

Philippians 2:13

for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

II Thessalonians 2:13

But we ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the firstfruits to be saved, through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth.

Ephesians 4:23-24

and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.

Question 24: What benefits do believers receive from the death of Christ?

Answer: At death the believer is seen as perfect and is glorified in Christ.

And to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect,

II Corinthians 5:8

Yes, we are of good courage, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord.

I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better.

Do not marvel at this, for an hour is coming when all who are in the tombs will hear his voice and come out, those who have done good to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil to the resurrection of judgment.

Question 25: What benefits do believers receive from the resurrection of Christ?

Answer: When the Christian is resurrected, he will be raised in glory, known to be acquitted on judgment day and enjoy God for all eternity.

I Corinthians 15:42-43

So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable. It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power.

Matthew 25:33-34

And he will place the sheep on his right, but the goats on the left. Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.

I John 3:2

Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is.

Question 26: What does God require of man?

Answer: God expects man to obey all that He has commanded.

Deuteronomy 29:29

The secret things belong to the Lord our God, but the things that are revealed belong to us and to our children forever, that we may do all the words of this law.

Micah 6:8

He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

I John 5:2-3

By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome.

II John 1:6

And this is love, that we walk according to his commandments; this is the commandment, just as you have heard from the beginning, so that you should walk in it.

If you love me, you will keep my commandments.



Question 27: Where is God's moral law revealed?

Answer: The moral law is revealed in the Ten Commandments and in man's own conscience.

Romans 2:14-15

For when Gentiles, who do not have the law, by nature do what the law requires, they are a law to themselves, even though they do not have the law. They show that the work of the law is written on their hearts, while their conscience also bears witness, and their conflicting thoughts accuse or even excuse them.

Romans 1:19

For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them.

Deuteronomy 4:13

And he declared to you his covenant, which he commanded you to perform, that is, the Ten Commandments, and he wrote them on two tablets of stone.

Matthew 19:17-19

And he said to him, "Why do you ask me about what is good? There is only one who is good. If you would enter life, keep the commandments." He said to him, "Which ones?" And Jesus said, "You shall not murder, You shall not commit adultery, You shall not steal, You shall not bear false witness, Honor your father and mother, and, You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Romans 7:7

What then shall we say? That the law is sin? By no means! Yet if it had not been for the law, I would not have known sin. For I would not have known what it is to covet if the law had not said, "You shall not covet."



Question 28: What is the summary of the Ten Commandments?

Answer: The summary of the Ten Commandments is to love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our strength, and with all our mind; and our neighbor as ourselves.

Matthew 22:37-40

And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets.

Deuteronomy 6:5

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.

Leviticus 19:34

You shall treat the stranger who sojourns with you as the native among you, and you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God.

Romans 13:9

For the commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Deuteronomy 30:6

And the Lord your God will circumcise your heart and the heart of your offspring, so that you will love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, that you may live.



Question 29: What does the preface to the Ten Commandments teach us?

Answer: The preface to the Ten Commandments teaches us that because God is Lord, we are bound to obey Him.

Exodus 20:2

I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

Luke 1:74-75

that we, being delivered from the hand of our enemies, might serve him without fear, in holiness and righteousness before him all our days.

Leviticus 19:2-4

“Speak to all the congregation of the people of Israel and say to them, ‘You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy. Every one of you shall revere his mother and his father, and you shall keep my Sabbaths: I am the Lord your God. Do not turn to idols or make for yourselves any gods of cast metal: I am the Lord your God.

Leviticus 20:26

You shall be holy to me, for I the Lord am holy and have separated you from the peoples, that you should be mine.

I Peter 1:14-19

As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, since it is written, “You shall be holy, for I am holy.” And if you call on him as Father who judges impartially according to each one’s deeds, conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile, knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot.

and is satisfied. Also he warms himself and says, "Aha, I am warm, I have seen the fire!" And the rest of it he makes into a god, his idol, and falls down to it and worships it. He prays to it and says, "Deliver me, for you are my god!"

Question 45: What is repentance?

Answer: Repentance is a saving grace where a sinner understands his sin and the mercy of God, and with grief and hatred of sin, turns to God and pursues obedience.

II Corinthians 7:10

For godly grief produces a repentance that leads to salvation without regret, whereas worldly grief produces death.

Acts 11:18

When they heard these things they fell silent. And they glorified God, saying, "Then to the Gentiles also God has granted repentance that leads to life."

Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.

Question 46: How is the Scripture effective in salvation?

Answer: The Holy Spirit makes the reading and preaching of the Word effective in convincing and converting sinners.

Acts 20:32

And now I commend you to God and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified.

Romans 10:14-17

How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!" But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?" So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

Acts 2:42-43

And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles.

Acts 4:33

And with great power the apostles were giving their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all.

II Timothy 4:1-2

I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching.

Question 47: How are we to read and hear the Bible?

Answer: We must study the Bible, receive it in faith, love, and practice it in our lives.

Psalm 119:18

Matthew 28:19

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Romans 6:3-5

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

Colossians 2:12

having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead.

John 1:33

I myself did not know him, but he who sent me to baptize with water said to me, "He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit."

Romans 8:11

If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.



Question 49: Who is to be baptized?

Answer: All believers are to be baptized.

Matthew 28:19

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

Acts 2:41

So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

Acts 16:14-15

One who heard us was a woman named Lydia, from the city of Thyatira, a seller of purple goods, who was a worshiper of God. The Lord opened her heart to pay attention to what was said by Paul. And after she was baptized, and her household as well, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come to my house and stay." And she prevailed upon us.

I Peter 3:21

Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ,

Acts 18:8

Crispus, the ruler of the synagogue, believed in the Lord, together with his entire household. And many of the Corinthians hearing Paul believed and were baptized.



Question 50: What is the Lord's Supper?

Answer: The Lord's Supper is the giving and receiving of bread and wine, in obedience to Christ's command. It represents the death of Christ, and is a proclamation of the believer's faith.

Luke 22:19-20

Question 51: What is prayer?

Answer: Prayer is offering our desires to God for things that agree with His will, in the name of Christ, with confession of our sins, and a thankful acknowledgment of His mercies.

And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us.

John 16:23-24

In that day you will ask nothing of me. Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full.

Daniel 9:4-5

I prayed to the Lord my God and made confession, saying, "O Lord, the great and awesome God, who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love him and keep his commandments, we have sinned and done wrong and acted wickedly and rebelled, turning aside from your commandments and rules.

Psalms 136:1-4

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever. Give thanks to the God of gods, for his steadfast love endures forever.
